

Eagle Coach / Eagle Coordinator

Guides Eagle candidates from Life rank through the final board.

OVERVIEW

The Eagle Coach (sometimes called Eagle Coordinator) is the troop's guide for scouts pursuing Eagle Scout. They know the paperwork inside and out, help scouts avoid common application mistakes, and ensure no candidate stalls in the final stretch.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1 Track all Life Scouts and their progress toward Eagle
- 2 Help scouts understand Eagle project approval requirements
- 3 Review Eagle applications before council submission
- 4 Coordinate Eagle Boards of Review logistics
- 5 Serve as a resource for Eagle project questions
- 6 Celebrate and recognize Eagle achievements with the troop

TIME COMMITMENT

2-4 hours/week depending on active candidates

The most common Eagle failure is running out of time after Life rank. Watch the clock.
